Currently, in the state of Georgia, there are nine inclusive college options for students with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. Programs such as the GOALS program at Columbus Sate University, provides students with a personally meaningful university experience in which students engage in college life as a foundation for active, lifelong career and community participation. The GOALS program uses a combination of inclusive classes, social engagement, career exploration, peer mentoring, and personal advisement to help students continue to expand their skills in self determination, community engagement, personal independence, and career development.
